



A Program Meeting High Expectations at a Lower Cost

- In the past seven years, **our LL.M. New York Bar passage rate has been 100 percent**, as compared to the national average of foreign educated candidates, which is less than 50 percent. **Our passage rate for the Louisiana Bar is also 100 percent.**
- In 2016-2017, the **average cost** of tuition & fees paid by our LL.M. candidates does not exceed **\$9,500 for the entire year**. This makes our LL.M. program one of the most affordable in the United States.



Curriculum

The LL.M. in Comparative Law requires two semesters in residence and a minimum of 26 credit hours of study. The academic year runs from early August until the end of May of the following year, starting with a two-week *Orientation* program. Students take *Introduction to United States Law* and *Legal Research and Writing*.

Students have great *flexibility* to tailor their coursework to match their individual interests and have the freedom to explore a wide variety of courses to suit their *professional plans*. LSU Law offers a full range of law courses, seminars, and skills development classes, especially in the business, transactional, corporate, and commercial law areas that are often important to international lawyers. Also, candidates must complete an academic writing project, either as an independent supervised research project or a seminar paper.
