### **Faculty Highlights**

Professor Christine Corcos is publishing her article "I Am the Master: Some Popular Culture Images of AI in Humanity's Courtroom" in volume 5, number 1 of the Savannah Law Review's symposium issue "Rise of the Automatons." The paper was listed on SSRN's Top Ten Download List for PRN: Applied Ethics for July 21, 2018.

Professor Baier reports that the Supreme Court Historical Society's Tricentennial Gala, co-sponsored by the City of New Orleans and the Louisiana Judiciary, held at the Orpheum Theater, September 29, was a spectacular society event under Chief Justice Bernette Johnson's leadership. Hundreds attended. Professor Baier is Secretary of the SCLAHS. He co-chaired the Gala Committee.

Professor Vicente has been invited to contribute a chapter on abuse of companies, to be published in Hanne Birkmose, Mette Neville & Karsten Engsig Sørensen, *Abuse of Companies*, Kluwer Law International, and a chapter to be published in Mateja Durovic, Kai Purnhagen, Marta Cantero & Lucila Almeida, Hart Publishing.

On September 17th, Professor Raff Donelson presented his paper "Moral Stability and Pragmatism" at Yonsei University in Seoul, South Korea.

Professor Keith Hall spoke on the subject "Frack Quakes? Facts and Law Relating to Induced Seismicity, Injection Disposal, and Fracking" in Houston, Texas at a conference of the Texas Bar Association's Advanced Oil, Gas and Energy Resources Conference on September 20, 2018.

The American Bar Association has invited Professor Baier to its Criminal Justice Roundtable, Mayflower Hotel, Washington, D. C., Thursday Nov. 1. He will present a chapter of his legal bio of Colonel Frederick Bernays Wiener, "Smashing the Silver Platter Doctrine." Fritz Wiener was the winning lawyer in *Elkins v. United States*, which abandoned Justice Frankfurter's nonsense that allowed admission in evidence of state officers' unconstitutionally seized evidence in federal court, so long as the feds had nothing to do with the state seizure. Colonel Wiener was Professor Frankfurter's student in the Federal Jurisdiction Seminar, Harvard Law School, 1929-30. So in this chapter, the student triumphs over the professor, which is the way it should be.

On October 22, 2018, Professor Olivier Moréteau will give a keynote address in London, at the comparative law event commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Notre Dame University Law Program in London.

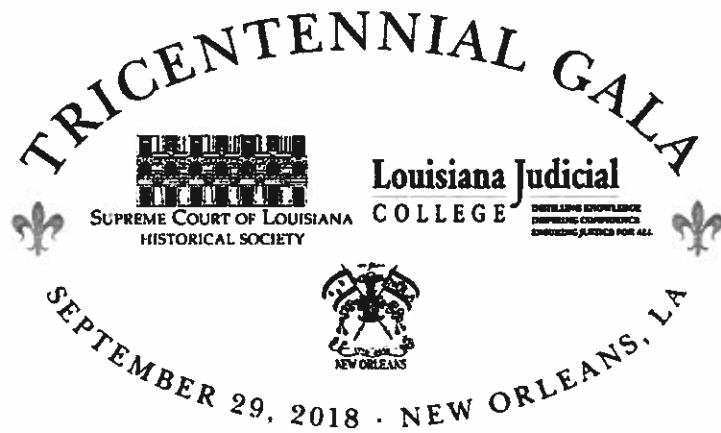
