### Faculty Highlights

Professor Bill Corbett spoke on Dec. 14 at the Baton Rouge Bar Association’s December 2018 CLE By-the-Hour seminar on recent developments in tort law.

Professor Keith Hall will serve as Co-Chair of “The Law of Fracking” two-day conference to be held January 23 and 24, 2019 in Denver, Colorado.

#### **Student Scholarship Reception**

The LSU Law Center will host its annual Student Scholarship Reception on March 12, 2019, at The Club at Union Square (formerly the Faculty Club) on Highland Road and Veterans Drive from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. The reception allows student scholarship holders and donors and/or

representatives to meet in person. Students should take this wonderful opportunity to thank their donor(s) or representative(s) for their generosity to the Law Center and to network with others.

### **Clinical Programs**

Students in the Parole & Reentry Clinic assisted 26 prisoners up for parole consideration in Fall 2018. 20 of those prisoners were granted parole (one case was continued). 11 of the twenty granted parole were originally sentenced to life in prison for crimes they committed when they were children.

The Prosecution Clinic students were sworn in as Special Rule XX prosecutors and immediately charged with the duty to seek justice. Our special prosecutors conducted misdemeanor trials, questioned witnesses in Grand Juries, conducted preliminary examinations and other pre-trial motions, assisted witnesses (such as the Coroner, officers, and victims) in trial preparation, and took an insiders tour of East Baton Rouge Parish jail and the Louisiana State Crime Lab.



In addition to successfully mediating Small Claims cases at Baton Rouge City Court in the Fall 2018, the students of the Civil Mediation Clinic helped design a program with LSU Cares and the Department of Residential Life on the main campus to mediate student grievances. This collaboration will give an opportunity for LSU students to meet with Civil Mediation Clinic Mediators in order to resolve disputes they may have with other students or with outside parties, such as landlords, etc.
