### **Judge Alvin B. and Janice G. Rubin Visiting Professor of Law**

The Law Center will host the Judge Alvin B. and Janice G. Rubin Visiting Professor of Law on March 18 and 19. This year's lecturer is the Honorable Stephen A. Higginson, federal judge on the United States Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals. The schedule includes classroom visits, informal luncheons with students and faculty, and culminates with the Rubin Lecture on March 19. The lecture, titled "The Fifth Circuit, Summer of 1963: 'A Causerie of ... Ethics in Negotiation,'" will take place at 5 p.m. in the Robinson Courtroom.

### **Dedication of the Dodson Maritime Collection and Lecture on the History of Maritime Commerce**

The dedication of the Richard "Jerry" Dodson Maritime Art Collection and a lively and informative maritime lecture by J. Revell Carr, former president and director of the Mystic Seaport, America's leading maritime museum will be held on Friday, March 8. Mr. Carr was a former naval officer, president of the Council of American Maritime Museums and the International Congress of Maritime Museums, and a noted author. He will provide a lecture at 12:40 p.m. in the Robinson Courtroom titled, "Creativity, Courage & Commerce – A Brief History of Ocean Trade," with added commentary on the history and significance of the various elements of the Richard J. "Jerry" Dodson Maritime Art Collection donated to the LSU Law Center.
